## 1 Aristocrats, Paupers & **Philanthropists**

An enjoyable stroll around the St Peter's area featuring the great and the (sometimes!) good of St Albans. Learn about the various buildings and charitable institutions they generously gave to the city. Their stories are all quite fascinating - but then some were among the most powerful people in the Kingdom!

# 2 Fishpool Street

This walk explores a route dating back to Saxon times with lots of interesting buildings. A 1000-year old route - once 5 a main coaching road - follows Fishpool Street to the picturesque St Michael's village with its elegant houses. Saxon church & Roman museum.

# 3 Harpenden Common

This walk covers the fascinating features and buildings around the West Common in Harpenden, including the site of the Harpenden Races.

## **Historic St Albans**

# 6 The Roman Theatre of Verulamium

#### Bluehouse Hill. St Albans

The Roman Theatre is the only complete theatre open to the public. The site also includes 3rd century town-house with underground shrine and shops fronting Watling Street. Guided tours on Saturday and Sunday.

## 7 Town, Crown and Cloisters

St Albans Abbey was founded by one king & destroyed by another nearly 750 years later and many monarchs meddled in the middle! This walk explores the uneasy relationship between the town, crown and abbey life at the monastery. Highlights in the Abbey include the wall paintings and the shrine of St Alban. This is a joint walk by the St Albans Tour Guides & the Abbey Guides.

# 8 Verulamium in a Nutshell

This walk explores Verulamium Park - site of Britain's 3rd largest Roman town and the only complete Roman Theatre. We also explore the remains of the Roman Walls, foundations of the London Gate and a superb mosaic.

#### 9 Wars of the Roses

# 10 Abbey Gateway

#### St Albans School, St Albans

The most complete medieval gateway in England. Tours from 1000 to 1530 every half hour. Tours take 35-40 minutes.

# 11 Cathedral and Abbey Church of St Alban

## Sumpter Yard, St Albans

From its elevated situation on the site of the execution and burial of St Alban, our first British martyr, the Cathedral has dominated its surroundings for over 900 years. It is a building of contrasting architectural styles from the Saxon period through to the great Victorian restoration and a 20th century Chapter house.

## 12 Clock Tower

#### Market Place, St Albans

Built between 1403 and 1412, the Clock Tower is the only medieval town belfry in England, and has its original bell. The tower has 94 steps to the top via a narrow spiral staircase giving fine views of the Cathedral & the City. The Tower and its fine bell have survived 600 years of use.

# Roman Mosaic (Hypocaust Building)

#### Verulamium Park, St Albans

In Verulamium Park lies the Roman Mosaic, part of a suite of rooms in a large town house built around AD200. Beneath a fine mosaic, there is an under floor heating system, a hypocaust. It is a precursor of modern central heating!

## 21 Ryder Building

#### Comfort Hotel, Holywell Hill

Now housing the Comfort Hotel, this was originally built as the headquarter offices of the Ryder Seed Company. Samuel Ryder is now best known for starting the Ryder Cup golf match, now played between America and Europe. On Saturday and Sunday there will a display by the City and District of St Albans Tour Guides in the Samuel Ryder Room, exploring the life and legacy of Samuel Ryder.

It is the only signal box adjacent to an operational main line railway with public access. Signalling demonstrations will run continuously, with video and slide shows. Steam traction engine rides and refreshments available.

# 9 St Peter's Church

#### St Peter's Street, St. Albans

St Peter's Church was founded in 948 AD, successive restorations have given a wholly Victorian appearance to a church containing a largely 15th century nave. Visitors will be able to ascend the tower

to see the ringing chamber & the bells where there will be explanatory displays. Depending on the weather, you will be able to go onto the tower roof, the highest point in St Albans.\*

## 32 The Roman Theatre of Verulamium

#### **Bluehouse Hill. St Albans**

Built in c.40AD, the Roman theatre is unique in Britain, being a theatre with a stage, rather than an amphitheatre and is the only fully excavated example of its kind in Britain. The main ruins were unearthed in 1847 and subsequent excavations have revealed shop foundations, a Roman villa and a secret shrine.

# 33 Verulamium Museum & Legion XIIII

## St. Michael's, St Albans

Situated in Verulamium Park, the Museum houses the vast collection of finds excavated from the site of Verulamium, one of the largest towns in Roman Britain. Using recreated Roman rooms, hands-on discovery areas, touch screens and video presentations, the Roman town is brought to life.

# 34 Wheathampstead Old Railway Station

## Access by roundabout Station Rd

A partially restored platform and railbed which until 2009 lay overgrown by ivy & sycamore, disused & all but forgotten. Has Victorian & later features, now used as a picnic site & part of the Village Heritage Trail. Unmanned and open access. The station was on the Hatfield to Luton & Dunstable Line, 2010 marks the 150th anniversary of the opening of Wheathampstead station as a passenger line. Through volunteer help it now springs back to life.

St. Stephen's is a historic pilgrim church, situated on the Roman road of Watling Street on the southern edge of St. Albans. The church includes a 13th century chapel, thought to be a Leper Chapel, a Tudor roof and some fine 19th century stained-glass. 
